
Aim

Introductory Activity



There are four basic types of sentence in the English language.



In this lesson we will concentrate on **Questions** and **Commands**.

Questions:

- •Questions ask something.
- •They start with a capital letter and finish with a question mark.
- •They can be answered.
- •They include a question word e.g. what, where, how, when, why, which, who, does, is, should...





Command:

- •A command is an order giving someone an instruction or telling them to do something.
- •It usually begins with an imperative bossy verb e.g. get, do, switch, tidy...
- •lt can be negative e.g. 'Don't stop!'
- •It can end with either a full stop or an exclamation mark.





The way something is read gives us a big clue to what type of sentence it is.

- 1. Hold your answer card so that you have your 'Question' card in your right hand and your 'Command' card in your left hand.
- 2. Close your eyes so you can really concentrate on your teacher reading out the sentences on the following slide.
- 3. Hold up the card that matches whether you think the sentence is a question or a command.
- 4. Check the answer were you right?

Can you write some commands for the soldier below?




e.g. Stand to attention.
